Parts of the follow up letters are as follows that outline the key points that where discussed with the Representatives and Senators.

“Dear Senator Webb:

I'm sorry we did not have the opportunity to speak during my recent trip to Washington, DC, but six of us from the American Society of Civil Engineers (ASCE) did get to meet with your Legislative Assistant Ms. Ashleigh Owens, on Wednesday, March 7, 2007. It was a pleasure speaking with her and having the opportunity to be heard regarding infrastructure issues in Virginia.

The National Infrastructure Improvement Act (S. 775) seeks to quantify and specifically address the nation's infrastructure needs as highlighted in the ASCE 2005 Report Card for America's Infrastructure. In addition, the Water Quality Financing Act (H.R. 720) will provide much needed funds to improve the nation's wastewater treatment systems.”

“Dear Representative Drake:

Thank you for taking the time to meet with Mr. Michael Bumbaco, Mr. Thomas Mlot, and myself, all of the American Society of Civil Engineers (ASCE) on Wednesday, March 7, 2007, in your office on Capitol Hill. It was a pleasure speaking with you and your legislative counsel Ms. Dena Kozanas and hearing your opinions regarding the built and planned infrastructure in your district.

And thank you for voting “Yes” on HR 720 (The Water Quality Financing Act of 2007)!

Our evening's speaker will be Bill Marcuson, our ASCE president. His topic will be "**The Future of Civil Engineering 2025**". Bill will share his vision of Civil Engineering and preparing the professional civil engineer (PE) for the future. He will discuss what effects globalization will have on Civil Engineering. He will also discuss how engineering must change in the good old USA for us to survive as a profession.

Dr. Marcuson is President of the American Society of Civil Engineers (ASCE) and is one of the nation's leading civil engineers. He has received five national awards from ASCE, including the Terzaghi Award and Norman Medal, civil engineering's oldest honor. In 1995 he was honored by the National Society of Professional Engineers as their Federal Engineer of the Year. His career has included research and administrative positions at the U. S. Army Engineer Waterways Experiment Station, where he served as Director of the Geotechnical Laboratory for nearly 20 years, prior to his retirement in 2000. He is the only engineer to be named the Corps of Engineer's Engineer of the Year twice (1981 and 1995), and he was honored by the Corps as their Civilian of the Year in 1997. He was elected to the National Academy of Engineering in 1996 for his contributions to the design and analysis of embankment dams.

The 2007 conference will return to Williamsburg on Wednesday and Thursday, September 19-20, 2007, at the Crowne Plaza Hotel at Fort Magruder (same same location as past years).

This educational conference is an annual statewide event that is directed towards all engineers in the Commonwealth of Virginia. It is jointly sponsored by the Virginia Society of Professional Engineers (VSPE) and the American Council of Engineering Companies of Virginia (ACEC/VA). TAC for Virginia Stormwater Standards

Technical Advisory Committee (TAC) - A special thank you to the members who have volunteered to be on this committee. We are expecting this committee to develop into an advisory role for DCR and VDOT concerning state guidelines and that blue book memorandum for specific BMP's might be developed as the need arises in the future.

So the *raison d'être* of this committee would include:

- Review and discuss Virginia regulations and guidelines with DCR on in-ground stormwater pollutant removal technologies to provide more consistency in the industry and to answer questions.
- Be an umbrella coordination group on the stormwater technologies in Virginia, and perhaps be active regionally through the Bay partnership, or nationally through EWRI and other groups.
- Be a technical committee of the ASCE Virginia Section; perhaps author memoranda or publications on the findings, both technical and regulatory, through ASCE.
- Be a showcase and model for the benefits of ASCE membership as to non-partisan, impartial, technically expert ASCE committees and impact public governance structures and the public itself from the standpoint of public health, safety, and welfare in some meaningful way. Also, help to be a positive force for improving water quality in Virginia.

The project will be a high-density blend of residential buildings, office space, specialty stores, restaurants, and a green recreational area along the river's edge providing public access to the river.
